Programmatic Summary & Goals

The objectives for this operational plan are to decrease the incidence of targeted driving violations, related crashes and to increase voluntary compliance with traffic regulations thereby decreasing fatalities and serious injury collisions by way of a proactive and highly visible enforcement effort. Officers involved in the campaign will take a zero-tolerance on the following violations: a) impaired driving violations, b) operating while intoxicated/impaired, and c) occupant restraint violations. The main purpose of this grant is for the enforcement of operating under the influence by motor vehicle operators.

Data Summary:

In Wisconsin during 2018 alcohol was listed as a contributing factor in 4.3% of all crashes. 27.3% of all fatal vehicle crashes in 2018 were alcohol-related, resulting in 159 deaths. Alcohol-impaired driving is associated with other high-risk behaviors that increase the likelihood of a crash and of significant injury or death occurring; these include speeding, and failure to wear seat belts.
