Grant funds will allow the purchase of above stated equipment by way of increasing the amount of total funding that would otherwise be available from local resources alone for such a purpose and equipment is intended to support regional law enforcement response efforts with ALERT.

Programmatic Summary:

Agencies that accept funding are responsible for all sustainment costs.

Milwaukee Police and the State Division of Criminal Investigation must develop and finalize an agreement for state response prior to completion of the grant and it must be on file with Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM). Equipment shall be maintained and available to use as intended by the grant for the duration of its useful life. Any proceeds from the sale of equipment at or near the end of its useful life will be considered program revenue and must be reinvested into eligible homeland security expenses.
