Please note the following:

1. Your Certificate of Appropriateness likely has very specific conditions of approval. Be sure to read the entire document, otherwise your final work product may not comply with the required standards for work.

2. Most projects require a city building permit. Call 414-286-8210 to confirm permitting requirements.

3. If you intend to apply for historic preservation tax credits (<u>wisconsinhistory.org/taxcredits</u>) for a project that also requires the approval of the Historic Preservation Commission, you must apply to both the city and the state simultaneously. The state will not approve tax credits for work completed prior to their approval under any circumstances. City and State reviews follow similar guidelines, but there are substantial differences in documentation requirements, so the two reviews are not considered equivalent. An approval from the city's Historic preservation Commission does not constitute an approval for historic tax credits. Likewise, an approval for historic tax credits does not constitute an approval for a certificate of appropriateness from the Milwaukee HPC. You must not begin work until you have received both approvals in writing and any required building permits. Inform all parties (Milwaukee HPC, Wisconsin Historical Society, contractors, etc.) that you are making both submittals.
