SERVICES & PROGRAMS





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ENERGY & FUEL USE

- 2018 MKE County operations used:
 0 4.1 million gallons diesel
 0 123,000 MWh electricity
 - $_{\odot}$ 4.7 million therms natural gas $_{\odot}$ 218,000 mlbs steam
- Primary source: fossil fuels
- Impacts environment and climate





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CLIMATE POLICIES

- File No. 07-111: Creates "Green Print" initiative for MKE County.
- File No. 17-506: Establishes County will support principles and targets of Paris Climate Agreement.
- File No. 19-582: Backs creation of City-County Climate and Economic Equity Task Force.



CLEAN ENERGY PLAN

- Adopted by MKE County Zoo in 2016
- Provides five-year roadmap for:
 Reducing energy use by 20%
 Reducing water use by 30%
- Progress to date:

o High-performance buildings
o Lighting and BCS upgrades
o Sustainability and HVAC staff





SUSTAINABILITY PLAN

- Adopted by MKE airport in 2018
- Includes 'Climate Change' and 'Economic Prosperity' focus areas
- Includes climate-related goals:
 - Develop carbon reduction program
 - Be regional leader in carbon mgmt.
- Recommends annual carbon inventory

Baseline inventory suggests 95% of MKE's emissions due to energy use.



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ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- 20% energy reduction goal
- 11% reduction from 2014-18
- \$9.2 million+ in upgrades
- New Energy Program Manager
- Building commissioning program

Fairfield Inn & Suites Location: West Milwaukee PACE Financing: \$1.1 million Est. Savings: \$81,000/year

Project #2



TownePlace Suites Location: Oak Creek PACE Financing: \$2.5 million Est. Savings: \$111,000/year





ELECTRIC BUSES

MCTS proposal*:

Initial fleet of 15 battery-electric buses
 Additional BEBs possible after 2025

- Up to 45% reduction in emissions
- Greater reductions possible with lower-carbon electricity.

- Develop roadmap for reducing emissions in line with Paris Climate Agreement.
