

#### COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (CIP)

- NIDC CIP matching grants support community projects that engage community members and physically improve neighborhoods in Milwaukee.
  - citywide grant opportunities
  - reimbursable grants
  - dollar-for-dollar matching grants up to \$4,000

#### COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (CIP)

- Common Council allocated funds to NIDC for implementation of Healthy Neighborhoods CIPs and Citywide CIPs:
- 17 projects were approved in 2019 for over \$70,600 leveraging more than \$135,000






