## Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) 2019-2022

**Allocation Purpose:** To purchase a new Training Management System, software, and additional Pole Camera Kits for the Milwaukee Police Department.

**Research & Evaluation:** Progress reports will be submitted every three months to the E-grants system.

### Program Goals:

Funds from this grant will be used to purchase the following:

- 1) MPD will select and procure a standard web-based software system to track and manage existing training requirements. This system help to merge existing physical MPD records — including academy training, firearms certification, etc. — with new e-learning options.
- 2) Maintenance and expansion of existing MPD software systems.
- 3) Four additional Pole Camera Kits. Remotely operated cameras are currently being employed by MPD to transmit live-recorded data. These cameras are mounted to poles and allow operators to surveil areas to reduce crime.

### Programmatic Summary:

During previous years, JAG funds have been used to develop operational and technical capabilities of MPD. By improving training and software systems, this grant will reduce administrative workload, while the added tactical capacities offered by adding pole cameras will have an immediate impact on high-crime locations.
