## Lincoln Avenue

- 40% of students live in the walk-zone
- 98% of students eligible for free or reduced lunch
- Enrollment
  - 75% Hispanic
  - 15% African American
  - 6% Multi-Racial
  - 2% White
  - 1% Asian
  - 1% Native American

## SAFETY

Students, families, staff and community members will work to align programs and resources to create a safer environment in Lincoln Avenue's school community.

#### Accomplishments:

- Traffic Calming Measures: 18<sup>th</sup> Street One Way Parking Restrictions & Flashing Ped Xing Lincoln Avenue & 18<sup>th</sup> St
- Speed Bumps (17th, 18th, 19th, Grant St.)
- Walking School Bus (3 years!)
- Neighborhood Safety Meetings (Over 1 year!)
  - Lincoln Village Opportunity Strategy, Safe Routes to School \$75,000, Alert Neighbor Program (\$10,000), Big Clean MKE
- Peace Ambassadors





# **SRTS Project**

## \$75,000 budget to improve traffic infrastructure.

- With guidance and support from volunteers from WI Bike Fed and SSCHC,
  125 of our students, all 4th and 5th graders
  - Studied incidents of traffic accidents
  - Using aerial maps provided by SRTS, created traffic calming plans
  - Submitted these plans to the City of Milwaukee

Wrote letters to different departments in Milwaukee, convincing officials

to take their plans seriously.
