Proposed Settlement of claims against the City of Milwaukee and police officers in the lawsuit, *Jimmy Harris v. City of Milwaukee, et al.*, Case No. 14-CV-1002-LA

Dear Council Members:

Enclosed please find a proposed substitute resolution. We ask that it be introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Legislation with the below recommendation. A companion substitute resolution to authorize contingent borrowing to fund the proposed settlement will be filed separately and should be referred to the Finance and Personnel Committee.

In the early evening hours of November 19, 2010, one of the defendant police officers stopped Jimmy Harris on East North Avenue, several blocks west of St. Mary's Hospital, to check on the registration of the vehicle being operated by Mr. Harris. Harris had recently undergone shoulder surgery and he informed the officer who detained him of this. The officer and Mr. Harris ended up in a continuing exchange after Mr. Harris exited his vehicle upon the officer's offer to view the information on the squad computer. Ultimately, the officer decided to arrest Mr. Harris for obstruction and there was a struggle as the officer tried to handcuff Mr. Harris. The detaining officer called for backup and two responding officers were finally able to ensure that Mr. Harris was handcuffed.

At some point in the course of this incident, Mr. Harris suffered a serious injury to a nerve in his shoulder. In the March jury trial of this matter, the jury determined that the detaining officer wrongly detained Mr. Harris, unlawfully searched the vehicle, and employed excessive force that caused

the injury to Harris' shoulder. They also found that the responding sergeant failed to intervene to end the unlawful detention and that the city failed in its training about certain types of vehicle stops.

The jury in its verdict awarded a total of \$1,675,188 in damages. Harris' counsel has agreed to a settlement of his attorneys' fees and costs in the amount of \$270,103.77. The total of these two amounts is \$1,945,291.77.

Because settlement in this matter is deemed expeditious, we request authorization to execute a settlement agreement on behalf of the city and its officers, and have enclosed an appropriate resolution for your convenience.
