Purpose of Millennial Task Force

Questions For Youth Council

- What are the objectives/passion areas of the Youth Council? (Personal)
 - Betterment of the lives of marginalized/disenfranchised communities
 - Help others
 - Human Rights

 - Focus: increasing mental health resources in schools
 - Amplifying the voice/opinion/needs of black/minority community members
 - CDGA Funds (ranked in order of priority by CDGA)
 - Mental Health
 - Youth Incarceration
 - Youth Homelessness
 - Reckless Driving
- How many council members intend on staying in the Milwaukee area?
 - 0 (0 out of the 8 members present intend on living in Milwaukee upon completion of higher education)
 - 2 members expressed interest in coming back to Milwaukee during the informal conversation
- How many council members intend on leaving the Milwaukee area?
 - 8 (8 out of the 8 members present intend on leaving Milwaukee upon completion of higher education)
 - Milwaukee is not a safe place for black people/youth

- Many members expressed interest in leaving as a way of expanding horizons, being on their own
- \circ $\,$ No HBCU in the Milwaukee area
- What do you love about Milwaukee?
 - Diversity
 - Sense of community: people are there for eachother, likely to know your neighbors, able to depend on them for support, sense of togetherness even in sometimes unsafe environments
- What concerns do you have about Milwaukee (personally/living here/staying here)
 - Racism in white-majority spaces
 - Lack of leadership that is willing to be outspoken about inequality in the city
 - Milwaukee has potential, but majority of people do not recognize it
 - Unfair treatment from MPD/History of Police Brutality. It is known to the youth council that it is their objective to protect and serve but there are alot of trust issues between the community and the police
