# Plan to Use CARES Act Payment to Milwaukee

## **Background Information**

- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provides payments to State, Local, and Tribal governments navigating the impact of COVID-19 outbreak
- Established \$150 billion Coronavirus Relief Fund Treasury responsible for issuing Fund payments to States and eligible units of local government.
- Local governments with populations over 500,000 were eligible for the funding.
- Guidelines for the use of the funding provided by the US Treasury indicate:
  - Necessary expenditures incurred due to COVID-19 public health emergency
  - Expenses not accounted for in budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020 (the date of enactment of the CARES Act) for the eligible government entity
  - □ Incurred during period March 1, 2020 December 30, 2020.

#### Uses of the CARES Act Payment

- Maximizes use of the payment for departmental expenses
- Provides funding for small business restart assistance Program
- Sets aside funding for a residential rental assist program currently in the process of being developed

## **Department Appropriations**

- Funding guidelines allow funding for:
  - Positions mainly assigned to COVID-19 related issues
  - Positions redeployed to COVID-19 activities
  - Other costs related to COVID-19
  - Costs related to compliance with stay at home orders
  - Costs related to safety improvements to work areas for employees returning to work
  - Any cost not reimbursed by the Federal Government for unemployment compensation
  - Worker's Compensation Costs

## **Department Appropriations** (Continued)

- Funding uses include:
  - Paramedics testing of symptomatic city employees at Engine House 5
  - Hazard Pay
  - Positive tested patient contact tracing including the use of redeployed staff from other departments
  - Costs associated with compliance of the stay at home act
  - Return to work safety costs
  - Enforcement of health orders
  - □ First responder costs

#### **Small Business Restart Grants**

- Provide a grant up to \$15,000 to small business that has no more than 20 employees and annual revenue up to \$2 million
- Used to pay expenses associated with retooling businesses to meet best practices for health and safety
- The program will not take applications on a first-come, firstserved basis, but instead will offer an application window for businesses to apply.
