MARQUETTE UPWARD BOUND PROGRAMS

Marquette's EOP Pre-college Division — Upward Bound and Upward Bound Math & Science — supports, guides and empowers first-generation, low-income young men and women as they strive to graduate high school, complete their baccalaureate degree and lay the foundation for life-affirming careers. The programs work with students, parents/guardians and high school officials to help participants develop the self-confidence and responsibility they need to succeed.

Since 1973, 95 percent of our Pre-college Division participants have graduated from high school in four years, and more than 90 percent of them have gone to college. As undergraduates, our pre-college program graduates collectively earn more than \$1 million in grants, scholarships and tuition reimbursement.

Educational Talent Search

- To increase the number of youth from disadvantaged backgrounds who complete high school and enroll in and complete their postsecondary education.
- The ETS program works with students in grades 6th through the 12th
- Typically ETS students are first-generation potential college students (neither parent received a four-year college degree) with limited income, and a strong desire to attend college.
- Participants receive a wide range of free services and participate in scholastic, cultural and enrichment activities.
- The Educational Talent Search program creates a college bound mentality in each student and family it serves and promote a college bound culture in each target school.
