Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations): Reduce the spread, morbidity and mortality of COVID-19 in communities of color adversely impacted by the virus in Milwaukee County with culturally responsive messaging, micro-campaigns with trusted influencer/thought leaders, and multi-lingual/multi-cultural community health worker remote psycho-social support.
