 Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations): The State of Wisconsin received funding through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic (CARES) Act. The State of Wisconsin used some of this federal funding to establish a Routes to Recovery Local Government Grant, administered by the State Department of Administration. Routes to Recovery funds are allocated to all units of local government based on population. The City of Milwaukee is allocated \$9,600,841. The City can be reimbursed for unbudgeted expenditures incurred in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, including emergency operations activities, purchases of personal protective equipment, cleaning and sanitizing supplies and services, temporary isolation housing, testing and contact tracing, medical and sick leave for public health and safety employees, and meeting local FEMA match requirements.

2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives: A primary strategic goal of the City is building safe and healthy neighborhoods, and this includes ensuring public health, including controlling the spread of communicable disease. The COVID-19 pandemic presents a public health emergency and the Routes to Recovery grant funding will enable the City to more effectively respond to and mitigate the COVID-19 outbreak.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs): The grant funds are needed to ensure the City has adequate funding for various activities necessary to respond to and mitigate the COVID-19 outbreak, including emergency operations, medical and protective equipment, cleaning and sanitizing public facilities, providing temporary isolation housing for individuals and families affected by COVID-19, providing testing and contact tracing, providing medical and sick leave for public health and safety employees affected by COVID-19, and possibly matching FEMA funds used in respond to the COVID-19 outbreak.
