Shepard Fairey (born February 15, 1970) is an American contemporary street artist, graphic designer, activist, illustrator, and founder of OBEY Clothing who is arguably one of the most famous artists living today.


He became widely known during the 2008 U.S. presidential election for his Barack Obama "Hope" poster.

His 110+ murals appear all over the world, in some of the most well-known places for monumental muralism. 6 of 7 continents.






This year we were nominated for a Governor's Tourism Award. Shepard Fairey chose us to be his local representatives in Wisconsin for a proposed DNC mural.




