I live in District 4 and own a business downtown. I believe the proposed mask mandate is ridiculous and unnecessary. Wisconsin and certainly Milwaukee are nothing like the "models" of San Francisco, LA, New York, etc. and should not be compared as such. Wisconsin has done a reasonably good job of being responsible and flattening the curve, the original goal of the shutdown.

There is no study that shows cloth masks are any more than possibly 2% effective and as even Dr. Fauci said, are largely symbolic and "show you care".

Milwaukee and Wisconsin data and statistics show we are already managing this well enough.
