- 3. On 11/02/2019 at 9:02pm officers conducted a license premise check at Aliota's Pub and Grill, 261 E. Hampton Av. The officer found no violations.
- 4. On 01/12/2020 at 11:30pm officers conducted a license premise check at Aliota's Pub and Grill, 261 E. Hampton Av. The bartender provided the business licenses and her Class D Operators license. The officer observed 6 electronic gambling machines with a sign affixed that stated "No cash outs under \$20 before leaving".
- 5. On 02/14/2020 at 2:25am officers were dispatched to a Sick/Injured complaint at 261 E. Hampton Av. When the officer arrived they found Whitefish Bay Police on scene with an

intoxicated subject, lying on his side throwing up on the ground. The subject was conveyed to the hospital for treatment. The officer went to Alioto's to investigate, finding the front door locked. Upon entering they observed 4 people inside with alcohol and money on the top of the bar. The officers spoke with the bartender who stated the intoxicated subject had been in the bar and had left about 30 minutes prior to the officer's arrival. The bartender stated 2 of the people in the bar were employees but they had gotten off work at midnight. One of the patrons in the bar attempted to leave but was too intoxicated to walk, so the officers conveyed him home. A check of the license revealed the bar had a closing time of 1:30am. On 02/19/2020 the officer spoke with the applicant regarding the situation. He stated he did not know why the license had a closing time of 1:30am. The applicant was cited for Allow Patron After Hours and the bartender was cited for over serving a patron.

On 11-02-19 at 9:02 p.m., I conducted a license premise check of Aliota's Pub & Grill, located at 261 E. Hampton Ave., which is a licensed premise in the city of Milwaukee.

I checked the Class B Tavern License, which is set to expire 07-23-20 and is currently valid. I spoke to the bartender Jessica BEVERLY (w/m 09-22-82), who does have a valid Class D Operator's License (229868), which is set to expire 12-31-19.

Everything in the bar appeared to be normal and BEVERLY was not having any problems while working at the bar. I informed BEVERLY that I would be notifying ALIOTA of my license check.

This report is written by P.O. Adam MARITATO, District Five, Late Power Shift. On Sunday, January 12, 2020 at approximately 11:30 p.m. Squad 5460 (myself and P.O. Robert PARKS wearing full duty uniforms, activated AXON body worn cameras and driving marked squad car #556) did a License Premise Check to do a Class B license check at 261 E. Hampton Ave. (Aliota's Pub and Grill) in the city and county of Milwaukee. Squad 5468 (P.O. David LETTEER and P.O. Russel MACRAE) was also present during the investigation.

Upon arrival we observed 21 people who were at the establishment.

I spoke with the bartender on duty, identified as Jessica M BEVERLY (w/f 09-22-82). BEVERLY holds a valid Class D license (0233311). BEVERLY assisted me in obtaining the tavern and food licenses. BEVERLY showed me a valid CLASS B license (0207414) and a valid Food License (0013151) for the establishment.

Officers did not see the establishment serving food while on scene.

P.O. MACRAE observed six (6) electronic gambling machines on scene. Affixed to the front of two of the machine was the sign "No cash outs under \$20 before leaving *applies to all machines*."

This concludes my report.

INITIAL INVESTIGATION

This license premise report is written by PO David LETTEER, assigned to District 5, Late Power Shift Tavern Squad 5468, with PO Russell MACRAE.

On 02-14-20 at 2:25 a.m., Sq. 5390 (PO SCHLEI and PO WHITLEY) was dispatched to an injured sick person, located at 261 E. Hampton Ave. This person was found by Whitefish Bay Police, unconscious, but breathing, lying in a snow bank and appeared to have hit his head. This incident was captured on our body worn cameras, which were active during this incident.

Upon the squad's arrival, there was a subject was on the ground in the parking lot of Aliota's pub and grill. Sergeant BOHN of the Whitefish Bay Police Department was on scene and was holding the subject (Mark NESCHADINENKO) up on his side. Sergeant BOHN stated that he had been sitting in the parking lot of the CVS pharmacy across the street when he was flagged down for the subject down in the Aliota's parking lot. Sergeant BOHN stated that when he came up to NESCHADINENKO, NESCHADINENKO was vomiting so Sergeant BOHN turned him to his side to prevent him from choking. Sergeant BOHN was unsure how long NESCHADINENKO had been down in the parking lot but he was unresponsive and appeared heavily impaired. MFD (Med 5, Green shift, LT. HOPGOOD) arrived on scene and took over care of the victim and Sergeant BOHN was able to find NESCHADINENKO's name in their records from a credit card NESCHADINENKO had left at the bar when he left.

PO SCHLEI briefly spoke with the bartender at Aliota's for the night, Jessica BEVERLEY, who stated that NESCHADINENKO was at the bar fairly regularly and had been drunk when he left. BEVERLY stated that NESCHADINENKO had left the bar roughly 20-30 minutes before we arrived. We had arrived on scene at 2:37am. MFD Med 5 arrived and conveyed NESCHADINENKO to St. Mary's Hospital and he was admitted at 2:53am under the care of Dr Sracic. There were no injuries observed on NESCHADINENKO and he was still passed out from the effects of alcohol when we left at 5:17am. It is unknown if NESCHADINENKO was under the influence of anything other than alcohol.

PO MACRAE and I know this address to be the address of Aliota's Pub & Grill. This is the only business open at this time of the night or in the area of Milwaukee or Whitefish Bay. This area is where the two jurisdictions meet. Upon our arrival, Sq. 5390 was speaking to several people outside. We observed the Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD) with a patient on a cart, being placed in the back of a MED rig. As we observed this, we observed the bartender Jessica Beverley (w/f 09-22-82), who has a valid Class D Operator's License (BART 233311), walking back into the bar with two other persons. While looking

inside of the bar, it appeared that the bar was still open for business, the interior lights were on, the televisions were still on and there was also another person sitting at the end of the bar.

We attempted to enter the bar, but the main door on E. Hampton Ave., was locked and someone from inside the bar had to open the locked door to let us in. It should be noted that the rear door, which leads to a parking lot, just to the south of the establishment, was not locked and still open for people to enter or leave the bar.

Upon entering the bar, we observed 4 people in the bar. Two of which were employees of the bar, who had stopped working at the bar before midnight, while one of the two employees was passed out, sleeping at the end of the bar. We observed numerous glasses on the bar top, along with bottles of Coors Beer and Red Bull cans. There was also money still on the bar top, as if people were still drinking and paying for drinks while inside of the bar. We spoke to BEVERLEY, who informed us that she was the only person working the bar tonight and the other two were employees that were not working, but believed that the employees even if they were not working could be in the bar passed bar hours. I asked BEVERLEY for her Class D License, as well as the Class B Tavern License, which she provided. While I was documenting the license info, I asked BEVERLEY what the closing time on the Class B License was. She informed me that it was 2:00 a.m., stating that is what she was told by other employees, as well as management. I informed her that her hours of operation for Thursday into Friday were 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. and that as the person in charge of the bar, she needed to know the hours of operation for the bar.

We asked BEVERLEY about the individual who was located in the snowbank and she stated he was at the bar for an hour and was served two Makers Mark drinks on the rocks. She stated after an hour, the individual left and after he left, the individual fell into a snow bank and shortly after that the police and fire department showed up. She stated the people in the bar were there because they were helping her with the individual who fell. We asked BEVERLEY if she had been drinking while working tonight and she stated she had. While speaking to her, one of the individuals who was inside of the bar, was instructed to leave, but it was determined by PO MACRAE and myself, that he was heavily intoxicated (possibly over served) and that he could not leave the bar by himself and make it home safely. This person could not walk more than a few steps before stumbling to the side. We informed this person that we would give him a ride home, so that he would make it home safely. This person stated he could drive, but BEVERLEY stated she wanted him to take an Uber home. This person then stated he could walk home and only lived a short distance away. Ultimately we were able to get his address, which was located at 5742 N Bay Ridge Ave in Whitefish Bay. To keep him safe, we convinced him to allow us to drive him home and enter his residence safely. The distance from the bar to his residence is 1.4 miles.

We informed BEVERLEY that we would contact the agent, John Aliota and explain the situation. I (PO LETTEER) contacted ALIOTA on 02-19-20 at 7:45 p.m. and explained the situation regarding our visit to the bar. ALIOTA stated that he was able to review the bar camera system and knew that times were being discussed for this situation was correct. ALIOTA also stated he did not know why his license had the close time of 1:30 on his license. I informed him that as the agent, he needed to be familiar with his open and close time, as well as the person bartending while he was not at the bar.

I was informed by ALIOTA that BEVERLEY told him that the person who was incapacitated, in the snow

bank, had entered the bar and appeared to be under the influence of something prior to being served alcohol at the bar. ALOITA was informed that he would be issued a citation for having 4 people in the bar after hours. I explained the bond formula to ALIOTA and informed him that citation would have a forfeiture of \$1,132.77. Due to the circumstances of the first incapacitated individual in the snow bank, as well as the second person we had to take home, we would be issuing BEVERLEY a citation for over serving her patrons.

The above application has been made by the above named applicant(s). This requires approval from the Licenses Committee and the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee. The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place virtually on 7/10/2020 at 9:10 AM. This is a public hearing. Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be asked to do so by phone or internet and are asked to contact the staff assistant, Molly Kuether-Steele at (414) 286-2775 or molly.kuether-steele@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
