Good Morning,

Please find the attached Section 106 approval for the Ravine Road Bridge in Lake Park. Note that this email string includes written concurrence from SHPO which is the current practice rather than a signature on the form.

The following additional attachments have also been provided to facilitate the Historic Preservation Commission's review:

3. Project Engineer Rich Johnson's email dated 9/25/2020 comparing Penetrating Sealer with Film Forming Coating (copy attached) in regard to graffiti on the bridge
4. Photos that were provided to SHPO during the course of their review. SHPO had the following questions during their review of the project: *"We have reviewed the above project and have a few questions about the TexCote. What color will you use and do you have any photos of the product being used on any other historic bridges?"* These photos of bridges with this coating were submitted in response to those questions. You will note in the photos that the TexCote does not hide the original concrete form marks and patterns nor does it cover over the texture of the concrete. For our project, we have several special provisions for the contractor to prepare mock-up panels to match the color and texture of the cured concrete for the reconstructed wingwalls and parapets. And please note that new concrete will not be coated, only existing concrete is proposed to be coated.

Milwaukee County and the County's design team highly recommend using an acrylic film forming coating on this bridge, as was recommended in previous documentation submitted to the HPC for this project.

I trust that this information will be helpful for the planned October 12th meeting of the Historic Preservation Commission, during which this item, City file 200521, will be scheduled. Should you need anything else, please reach out to me.
