## MPD Court Appearances – Municipal Court

The Municipal Court follows these standard procedures when scheduling trials that will involve officer subpoenas:

- Select trial dates and times that coincide with an officer's shift
- Reference 'off group' information provided in the citation narrative to select trial dates that avoid the days the officer is not scheduled to work that week
- Reference vacation information provided in the citation narrative to select trial dates that avoid days an officer has already requested vacation/time off

The Court also recently implemented the use of Final Pre-Trial conferences, approximately 1 week ahead of a scheduled trial date. These conferences often result in resolution of the case, such that subpoenas for the trial date can be called off.

In 2019, of the 560 officers who were subpoenaed, the median number of subpoenas per officer was 1, while the average was 2. Most officers (452 of the 560) were subpoenaed for just 1 or 2 different trial dates/times throughout the year, while 100 were subpoenaed for between 3 - 5 different trial dates/times and 8 were subpoenaed for between 6 - 11 different trial dates/times.
