# VISION ZERO =

**RESIDENTS**, COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS, +LOCAL GOVERNMENT WORKING TOGETHER TO SOLVE TRAFFIC SAFETY THROUGH...

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Prioritize **safety** + **accessibility** in areas most impacted by traffic violence.

**Engage people** in planning and decision making.

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Promote a **culture that prioritizes safe travel options** for all residents + visitors.

**Collaborate** with community groups + government agencies to encourage safe travel.

**Build streets for all users** to drive, bike, walk, and roll.

Use **data** to design + redesign roadways to be safe, convenient, and comfortable. Ensure that all road users understand + follow traffic laws.

**Reduce traffic speeds** in areas where crashes are common + most dangerous.



### Local Data



#### **Fatalities are UP**

As of **11/8/20** there were **87** car related fatalities in Milwaukee Co. In **2019**, there were **74** for the entire year In **2018**, there were **68** for the entire year



**76** people on average die in traffic crashes per year in Milwaukee Co.





#### Between June-September 2020 in the City of Milwaukee,

43 fatalities 2435 people injured 1694 total injury crashes

### **Becoming a Vision Zero City**

Over 35 cities around the country have adopted Vision Zero with proven success. The Vision Zero Network offers support and resources for all communities committed to Vision Zero including: informational webinars, in-person meetings, conference panels, case studies, and hands-on resources that share successful strategies.

- 01 | Set a clear goal for eliminating traffic fatalities and serious injuries
- 02 | Mayor & or members of Council officially & publicly commit to Vision Zero
- **03** | Vision Zero Strategy is in place, or Mayor has committed to doing so in a set time frame
- **04** | Key city departments (including Health, Transportation, Public Safety are engaged)





### **Proposed Timeline**

#### Identifying crashes + forging partnerships

Launch the city-wide crash data analysis and predictive modeling. Grow a coalition of community stakeholders + identify a key government departments to curate a Vision Zero *pilot* 

#### Galvanize a Vision Zero Strategy

Through an assessment process the Vision Zero Coalition will continue to expand their network and a full strategy should be complete before the end of the Summer. Come budgetary season investments should be in place to commence Vision Zero at the start of the new year (i.e. scaled up programs and new personnel)



#### Launch a Vision Zero Pilot

Community stakeholders, residents, and local government will put together a small pilot both new and existing strategies in concentrated areas where our data indicates the most need for intervention. A Vision Zero Coalition will form and a set Visionary timeline, and pass a Vision Zero Resolution at Council.

#### Vision Zero in Play

Vision Zero should be set in motion. A Vision Zero Coordination team should hold FTE at the City of Milwaukee. These coordinator(s) will be in charge of monitoring the program. This can include but not limited to, maintaining the presences of the coalition ;including prioritizing the concerns, needs and efforts of residents and community stakeholders, and monitoring internal communications and programmatic output for optimal and equitable outcomes

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
