OUTBREAK INVESTIGATIONS

- The State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) defines a COVID outbreak at a business as 2 or more cases. Long Term Care Facilities are defined as an outbreak at 1 case.
- We initiate contact with business when we are notified of 1 COVID + employee.
- Step 1: Phone consultation to review current COVID Safety measures and provide feedback.
- Step 2: Initiated when approximately 3% of the workforce is identified as COVID +. MHD staff conduct an onsite assessment providing solutions to COVID safety gaps
- Step 3: Initiated when approximately 5% of the workforce is identified as COVID +. MHD issues an order to provide a mitigation plan which could include closure and testing off all employees.





FINANCE UPDATES

- The Health Department has requested an extension of the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin grant to December 31st 2020.
- The Health Department's State of Wisconsin's Routes to Recovery of \$3M is funding emergency operations, PPE, sanitation supplies and services, isolation housing, testing, contact tracing, and sick leave.
- The Department's State of Wisconsin COVID Grant of over \$6M has been centered on costs related to contact tracing.
- An award for the Public Health Emergency Preparation Grant from the State of \$319,900 has focused on the staffing and operations of the isolation facilities.
- The Health Department's Laboratory is seeking approval for a grant that will expand their operations by adding four positions along with operating and equipment allocations of over \$7M until November 11th 2022.
