Dear Committee Members:

I am the retired Executive Director of Legal Action of Wisconsin; the largest Wisconsin law firm serving traditionally marginalized and poor communities. I strongly support Leon Todd's appointment to lead the Fire and Police Commission. I participated in the hiring of Lee at Legal Action, when he decided to leave private practice at Foley & Lardner and pursue his passion for social justice. Lee worked for Legal Action for approximately five years as a strong advocate for low-income clients. During that time, he left his mark as an effective legal analyst, good writer, and a strong litigator. His work included both standard eviction cases, complex issues in federal court, and the application of government regulations to state law. He understands that government organizations must follow existing regulatory frameworks.

Lee left Legal Action for the Public Defender Appellate Division as I assumed my role as Executive Director for Legal Action (I retired in July, 2019). I acted quickly to appoint him to Legal Action's board of directors because of his legal skills and personal qualities.
