

Extended Supervision

- “At the end of 2007, more than half (**55%**) of the people incarcerated in state prisons were there because they had failed to comply with the conditions of community supervision or because they had committed a new crime while under supervision” (Source: Justice Reinvestment in Wisconsin, May 2009 Council of State Government Justice Center)
- On average, **3,627** adults are released from prison to Milwaukee County each year
- Releases to Milwaukee County represent **44%** of all releases from prison
- At any point-in-time, **10%** of all persons on supervision in Milwaukee County are supervised at Intensive or High Risk levels
- As of December 31, 2009 there were **13,903** individuals on Extended Supervision in Region 3 (Milwaukee County), including **1,808** in an absconder status
- Of the 13,903 persons on Extended Supervision, **10,815 are for felony offenses** (3,088 are for a misdemeanor offense).
- In 2009 the Milwaukee Police Department made **4,784** arrests for Violation of Probation / Parole (VOP). **591** individuals were arrested more than once for VOP in 2009.

- VOP arrests accounted for approximately **14%** of all arrests in 2009
- **57%** (2,716) of the VOP arrests involved additional charges at the time of arrest.
- The accompanying charges include...
 - Resisting/Obstructing (18%)
 - Felon in Possession of a Firearm (8%)
 - (30% of all FIPOF arrests)
 - Battery (7%)
 - Robbery (6%)
 - (13% of all Robbery arrests)
 - Burglary (5%)
 - (12% of all Burglary arrests)
- Between October and December 2009 MPD made **2,061** home visits
 - 1,185 (58%) MPD Only
 - 420 (35%) with address misinformation
 - 866 (42%) DOC and MPD
 - 648 (31%) Contact made with offender
 - 131 (6%) Resulted in arrests
