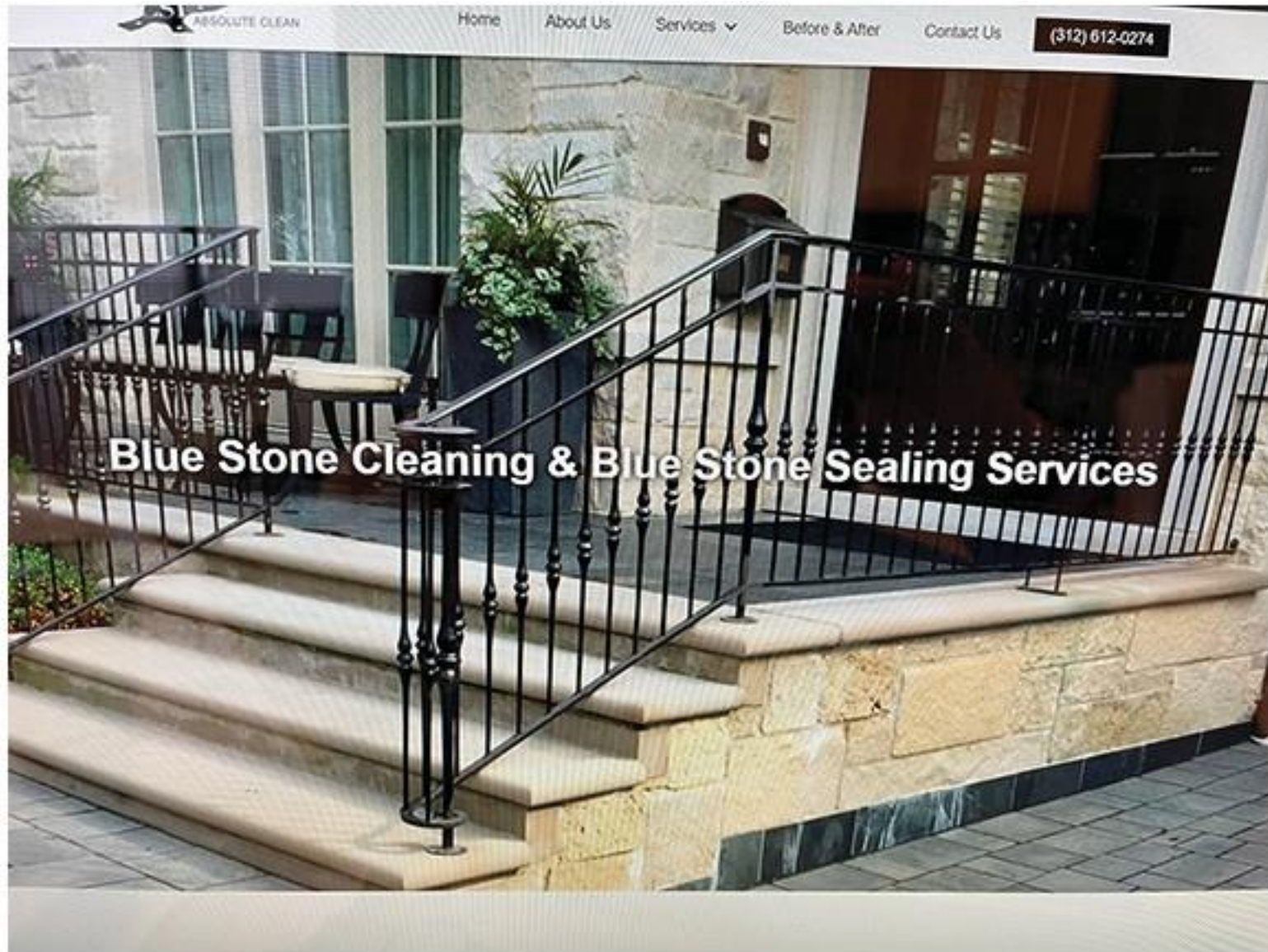

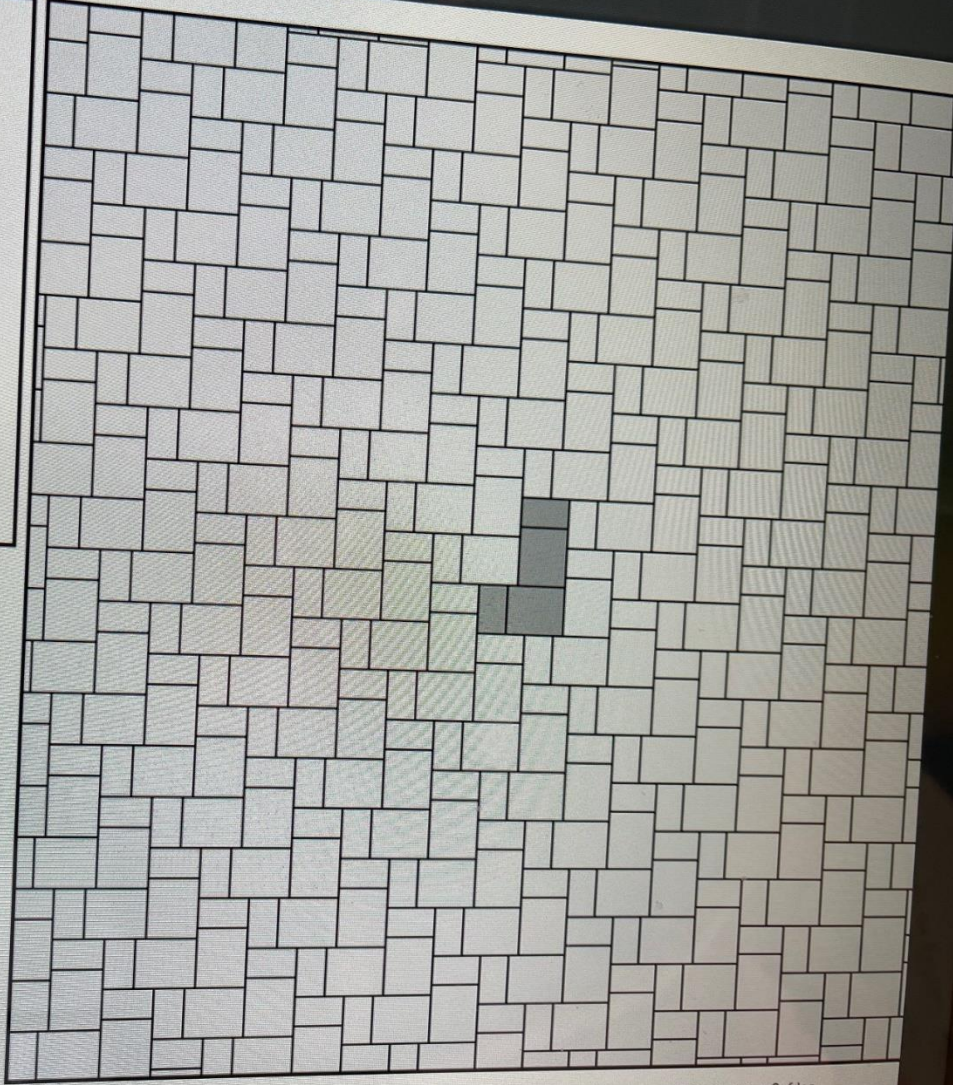

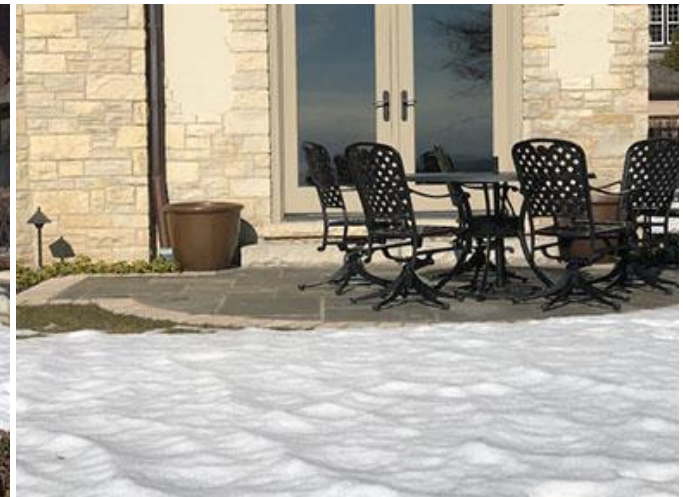

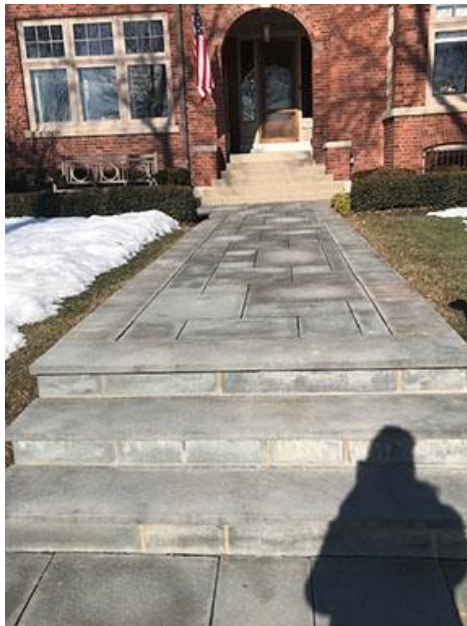

Thank you very much for the closeup photos of the porch tile and the pattern that you are proposing to install. The irregular shapes of the proposed patio material match the irregular shaped cuts of the stone walls of the house better than the regular repeating pattern of the red tile. Is the color of the proposed pattern compatible to the house stone?

The back steps to the house are connected to an entrance, so that would be an eligible expense.
