Programmatic Summary & Goals

The objectives for this operational plan are to decrease the incidence of targeted driving violations, related crashes, and to increase voluntary compliance with traffic regulations thereby decreasing fatalities and serious injury collisions by way of a proactive and highly visible enforcement effort. Officers involved in the campaign will have a zero-tolerance policy on the following violations: a) speed and aggressive driving violations, (b) operating while intoxicated/impaired, and c) unrestrained occupant violations. The main purpose of this grant is for the enforcement of speeding, aggressive driving, and operating under the influence by motor vehicle operators.

Data Summary:

In Wisconsin during 2019, speed-related crashes were listed as a contributing factor in 15.0% of all crashes. A total of 160 people died in these crashes. Excessive speeding is often associated with other high-risk behaviors that increase the likelihood of a crash and of significant injury or death occurring; these include following too closely and failure to wear seat belts.
