TID 108 - Terms

- \$12,100,000 initial grant to the Company for building renovations and at least 1,210 employees by Year 6
- Subsequent \$7,900,000 grant if expansion occurs (up to 790 additional employees), Company-Financed, 4.5% interest for no longer than year 20 of the TID
- Community Benefits:
 - Human Resources Agreement: 25% SBE and 40% RPP
 - Commitment to \$15/hour for service workers
- Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Agreement

TID 108 - Budget and Feasibility

TOTAL	\$20,200,000
Administration (\$147,500 + \$7,500 x 7 years)	\$200,000
Subsequent Grant to Company (Monetary Obligation)	\$7,900,000
Initial Grant to Company	\$12,100,000

If no expansion and only the Initial Grant is released, the District is able to pay off by Year 18

If expansion occurs and the entire Subsequent Grant released, the District is able to pay off by Year 19
