## **Accomplishments and Activities in 2020**

## **Changes in Committee Membership**

Ald. Khalif J. Rainey of the 7<sup>th</sup> aldermanic district in the City of Milwaukee joined as a new member and chair of the committee, replacing Ald. Russell W. Stamper, II, with his appointment as the new chair of the City's Community and Economic Development Committee in May 2020.

## **Renewal of Sister City Relationships**

## **Bomet County, Kenya (PENDING)**

The Sister Cities Committee at its November 23, 2020 meeting recommended to renew the sister city relationship with Zadar contingent upon acquisition of a local nonprofit sponsor. A local nonprofit sponsor was still pending. The sister city relationship had expired on November 23, 2020. Subject to the acquisition of a local nonprofit sponsor, a resolution would be submitted to the Common Council of its adoption and the Mayor for his signature.

The sister city relationship with Bomet County was first established on July 30, 2015 when the original resolution CCFN 141899 was signed by the City of Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett. An official agreement for the sister city relationship was signed at Milwaukee City Hall on November 23, 2015 between Mayor Tom Barrett and Governor H.E. Hon Isaac Ruto of Bomet County.

Both cities share a common interest in education, health care and business, and mutual understanding. Activities of the relationship thus far include students visiting Bomet, supply of materials to Bomet, and the drilling of a water well in Bomet. There is no current local sponsor to the relationship. The previous local sponsor was the Pan-African Community Association, Inc., which is no longer in existence.

### Zadar, Croatia

The sister city relationship with the City of Zadar, Croatia was renewed on December 28, 2020 after Mayor Tom Barrett signed a resolution renewing

the sister city relationship via Common Council File Number 201103. The Sister Cities Committee at its November 23, 2020 meeting recommended to renew the sister city relationship with Zadar. The Common Council adopted resolution CCFN 201103 to renew the sister city relationship on December 15, 2020.

The sister city relationship with Zadar was first established on November 25, 2014 when the original resolution CCFN 140088 was signed by the City of Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett. An official agreement for the sister city relationship was signed at Milwaukee City Hall on May 12, 2015 between Mayor Tom Barrett and Consul General of the Republic of Croatia Dr. Jelena Grcic Polic on behalf of the Mayor of Zadar Bozidar Kalmeta.

Both cities share a common interest in business, culture, health care, education tourism, and other areas. The relationship has been centered on culture and water research and education. There is a main focus to build a water research project between middle schools from both cities. The Milwaukee local sponsor to the relationship is the Federation of Croatian Societies, Inc. of Milwaukee.

At the **July 20, 2020** meeting, the committee:

- Welcomed Ald. Khalif J. Rainey as a new member and chair to the committee.
- Held review of the renewal application to extend the sister city relationship with Zadar, Croatia due to nonappearance by the local nonprofit sponsor.
- Reviewed and approved the 2019 annual reports for the sister city relationships with Tarime District (Tanzania) and Bomet County (Kenya); reviewed and approved the 2020 annual reports for the sister city relationships with Bomet County (Kenya), Galway (Ireland), and Irpin (Ukraine); and held review of 2019 annual report for the sister city relationship with Zadar (Croatia) and the 2020 annual report for the sister city relationship with Daegu Metropolitan City (South Korea) due to nonappearance.
- Was given sister city relationship status update from Ghana Milwaukee Association Inc. regarding a delay in the signing of the sister city relationship with Tema, Ghana.
- Discussed the success of the virtual 2020 Sister Cities International annual conference, the uncertainty regarding the 2020 Holiday Folk Fair and a meet-and-greet due to the COVID-19 pandemic and departure of City Clerk event coordinator staff, and continued efforts to promote sister cities.
- Reviewed and approved the 2019 Sister Cities Committee annual report.

#### At the **November 23, 2020** meeting, the committee:

- Reviewed and approved the renewal applications to extend the sister city relationships with Zadar (Croatia) and Bomet County (Kenya) with the contingency that a local nonprofit sponsor organization be acquired for the relationship with Bomet County.
- Reviewed and approved the 2019/2020 annual report for the sister city relationship with Zadar (Croatia) and the 2020 annual reports for the sister city relationships with Daegu Metropolitan City (South Korea), Tarime District (Tanzania), and Medan (Indonesia).

- Approved the withdrawal of the Hmong Wisconsin Chamber of Commerce as the local nonprofit sponsoring organization for the sister city relationship with Medan (Indonesia).
- Was given another sister city relationship status update from Ghana Milwaukee Association Inc. regarding a delay in the signing of the sister city relationship with Tema, Ghana and potential future exchange possibilities with Port Milwaukee.
- Discussed the success of the virtual 2020 Holiday Folk Fair and uncertainty on a meet-and-greet.
