VACCINE UPDATE

MHD has administered over 55,000 Doses to DATE

- 10.4% Fully Vaccinated
- 21.3% Single Dose
- Wisconsin Center 4,000 doses/day (2,700 currently)
- FEMA April 6th
 - 3,000 FEDERAL DOSES (1/3 for Community/Mobile Sites)
 - 120 Federal Staff DOD

SVI INFORMATION ON MILWAUKEE

- Socioeconomic status (below poverty, unemployed, income, no high school diploma)
- Household composition & disability (aged 65 or older, aged 17 or younger, older than age 5 with a disability, single-parent households)
- Minority status & language (minority, speak English "less than well")
- Housing type & transportation (multiunit structures, mobile homes, crowding, no vehicle, group quarters)


Evaluating Vulnerability and Equity

How can we identify disparities in vaccine distribution?


- The vaccination rates of communities within Milwaukee County identify where doses are being allocated
- The CDC's Social Vulnerability Index Score identifies the communities most vulnerable
- By combining these two factors, we can identify vulnerable populations being underserved and shift resources accordingly

Goal: Move communities from **orange** to **green** to ensure that vaccinations are going to those most vulnerable


Vaccination Rates






Cumulative COVID-19 Hospitalizations


