Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition attend the virtual hearing and are willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. This report is written by Police Officer Corstan D. COURT, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 4-21-2002 at 11:40am, a 19 year old Milwaukee Police Aide, at the direction of Milwaukee Police Officers, entered Northtown Supermarket, 4402 N 27th St. The police aide was able to purchase a 6 pack of Budweiser beer from a clerk, Murat S Mukam, who did not ask for any ID. The manager on the premise was a Ilhami Coskun. There were also 2 cartons of milk for sale which had expiration dates of 4-18-2002 on them. The licensee of the premise, George Kusak stated that the milk was a mistake and that he had never been cited for this before and also that this was a conspiracy and that the Milwaukee Police Department was out to get him.

2. On 04/08/06, Milwaukee Police officers were conducting investigations of sales of tobacco products to underage persons. Officers sent in a male who was 15 years of age into the Buyrite Food & Liquor to purchase a pack of cigarettes. The clerk, identified as Tayfun Eke, sold a pack of Newport cigarettes to the 15 year old without asking for any identification. A citation was issued for Sale Of Tobacco Products to Underage.

3. On 05/09/07 at 10:54 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2500 N 35th Street for an Armed Robbery complaint. Investigation revealed the victim was approached by two suspects demanding property as the victim was delivering produce to Buy Rite Food Store. The victim ran into the store and the suspects followed only to be chased away by other employees who were inside the store. Officers attempted to speak with the owner, George Kusak, who was uncooperative and argumentative. Kusak was hindering the investigation by attempting to clean up produce that was dropped at the crime scene and Kusak was also allowing citizens to walk under the crime scene tape so they could enter his business to shop after he was told by officers no business could be conducted until after the investigation was completed.

- 4. On 10/03/07 at 1:21 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 35th and Wright a Burglar Alarm complaint. Investigation revealed that an entry was found at the Buy Rite Food located at 2500 N 35th Street. Entry was gained through an inner window with the front door found wide open. Officers watch the store's video tape recordings and observed unknown suspects removing items from the store. A report was filed.
 - 5. On 12/30/12 at 3:50 pm, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 2500 N 35th Street. Investigation found the clerk, Abdel Muhamad, did not possess a valid bartender's license and was selling alcohol at the business. Officers then called the agent, George Kusak, and advised him of the violation. Kusak became angry when he learned he would be cited and was uncooperative with officers.



6. On 01/17/13 at 10:30 am, Milwaukee police, along with an agent from Department of Revenue, conducted a License Premise Check at 2500 N 35th Street. Investigation found the business had tobacco products and did not have invoices for them. Also observed were single cigarettes for sale on the counter. The agent confiscated several brands of tobacco and advised George Kusak of the violations found.

- 8. On 08/14/2016 Milwaukee police responded to an entry complaint at 2500 North 35th Street (BuyRite Food & Liquor). Investigation revealed several subjects gained entry to the closed business by prying a locked door. The suspects stole an ATM machine, a television, and an undetermined amount of alcohol. Milwaukee police incident report #162270048 filed.
- 9. On 01/01/17 at 10:27 pm, Milwaukee police responded to an entry at 2500 W Libson. Investigation found that a side door to the business had been forced open by unknown means. Interior security cameras were viewed and showed that no entry to the business itself was made. A review of the exterior cameras could not produce any suspects due to some painting that had been done on the building in which the cameras had been partially painted over. A report for the damage was filed.
- 10. On 03/18/17 at 4:29 pm, Milwaukee police observed a known subject to be sitting on the front steps of the Buy Rite Liquor store. This subject had been banned from the location by the owner and it was known by police that she was not allowed on the premise. She was arrested and later cited for trespassing, loitering and possession of drug paraphernalia.
- 11.On 07/16/2019 at 11:42am officers were dispatched to a subject with weapon complaint at Buy Rite Foods, 2500 N. 35th St. The officers interviewed the manager, who stated a known subject came into the business with a broken beer bottle causing a disturbance. The officer advised the manager on how to get a restraining order against the subject.
- 12. On 12/08/2019 officers investigated an attempt burglary at Buy Rite Foods, 2500 N. 35th St. The investigation revealed a masked subject used a pry bar to open the back door which set off the alarm, causing the subject to flee. The owner, Willy KUSAK, was on scene and cooperative, providing video of the incident to the officers.

The above application has been made by the above named applicant(s). This requires approval from the Licenses Committee and the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee. The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place virtually on 6/2/2021 at 1:10 PM. This is a public hearing. Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be asked to do so by phone or internet and are asked to contact the staff assistant, Molly Kuether-Steele at (414) 286-2775 or molly.kuether-steele@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
