City of Milwaukee Overview


What DPW teams salt and plow?

1,472 miles of Milwaukee streets = 7,000 lane miles of street to salt and plow

378 miles of dead ends364 cul-de-sacs

42,000 +/- corners/crosswalks 59 miles of non-assessable sidewalks

3,417 bus stops



Snow and Ice Control Planning

April 15th Summer work season begins

- May Debrief from snow season and future planning Snow fleet dismantled/trucks redeployed
- June Review/recalibrate routes Revise contracts Establish private relationships Review SOPs Review next season schedules/staffing levels
- July Salt order

Update Snow website Prepare job/vacation selections and vacation for Driver safety & refresher plow training

Aug Snow management team season prep meeting

- Sept Preventative maintenance completed by Fleet Begin recalling trucks from other Departments Driver Snow route picks Confirm salt, Calcium Chloride and brine levels
- Oct New plow driver training Confirm snow dump locations Confirm private relationships Fill brine tanks Prep plow blades All teams meetings/trainings October 17th earliest inch of snow November – March SNOW SEASON April 30th Winter schedules end







 - Freezing cold frozen cars
- Service delays garbage/recycling

- Expand Retiree Mentorship Program




