Substitute resolution creating a task force relating to African-American male unemployment.

..Analysis

This resolution creates a task force relating to African-American male unemployment in the City of Milwaukee. Task force members, in addition to Common Council members, shall represent business, professional, faith-based, community based and educational organizations. The task force shall select its chair, and the chair of the Judiciary and Legislation Committee shall serve as co-chair. The task force shall be staffed by the City Clerk's Office. The task force shall report its findings to the Common Council within 6 months of the date of its first meeting.

..Body

Whereas, Joblessness among working-age African-American males has grown considerably since the 1970s; and

Whereas, The unemployment rate of African-American males in the City of Milwaukee is unconscionably high; and

Whereas, The City of Milwaukee has one of the highest rates of African-American male joblessness and largest racial disparities in jobless rates among United States cities; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that a task force shall be created relating to African-American male unemployment; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the task force membership shall consist of the following:

- 1. Chair of the Community and Economic Development Committee or his designee.
- 2. Chair of the Judiciary and Legislation Committee.
- 3. Green Jobs Marketing Representative, Laborer's International Union of North America Great Lakes Region Organizing Committee.
- 4. First Vice President of the Milwaukee Branch of the NAACP.
- 5. Organizer of the Institute for Wisconsin's Future.
- 6. Senior Fellow and Founding Director of the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee Center for Economic Development.
- 7. President of the Metropolitan Milwaukee Association of Commerce.
- 8. President of the Greater Milwaukee Committee.
- 9. Human Resources Director of the Milwaukee Workforce Investment Board.
- 10. Executive Director of the African-American Chamber of Commerce.
- 11. Executive Director of the Social Development Commission or her designee.
- 12. Dr. Michael Rosen, Economics Professor at the Milwaukee Area Technical College.
- 13. Bishop Sedgwick Daniels, Holy Redeemer Institutional Church of God in Christ.

- 14. Pastor Ken Wheeler, Milwaukee Inner City Congregations Allied for Hope.
- 15. Gerard Randall, New American Institute.
- 16. Executive Director of the Urban League or his designee.
- 17. Executive Director of the Spanish Center or his designee.
- 18. Dr. Lenard Wells, Concordia University Wisconsin.
- 19. 2 members appointed by the Mayor.
- 20. 2 members appointed by the Common Council President.

Further Resolved, That the task force shall select its chair, and the chair of the Judiciary and Legislation Committee shall serve as co-chair; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the City Clerk's Office shall staff the task force; and, be it

Further Resolved, All City departments are directed to assist the task force in carrying out its mission; and, be it

Further Resolved, The task force shall report its findings and recommendations for implementations to the Common Council within 6 months of the date of its first meeting and then be automatically dissolved.
