Goals & Objectives

- Provide expenditure authority for anticipated grants for specific operating purposes
- Support objectives and strategies of departments that receive grants

2022 Budget Summary

- 1. 2022 Proposed Budget: \$267.3 million
 - \$46.3 million in anticipated grants
 - \$216 million in unanticipated grant authority
- 2. Seven departments anticipate operating grant funding in 2022
- 3. 54 separate anticipated grants
- 4. \$858,000 average anticipated grant amount
- CDBG and HOME grants comprise 43.6% of total grant funding


Key Issues

- 1. Obtaining new grant funding sources
- 2. Coordinating grant applications
- 3. Manage decreases in grant funding
- 4. Majority of grant funding through the Federal Government (92.5%)
- Managing the American Rescue Plan Act grant

2022 ARP Funding

- Unanticipated grant funding increased by \$213 million to \$221 million
- Reflects second ARP payment in 2022
- First ARP payment of \$197.1 million received in May 2021
- Second ARP payment of \$197.1 million anticipated in May or June 2022

Grants Expenditures vs CDBG & HOME Grant Awards (in millions)



2020 Expenditures

- 2020 Expenditures of \$163.4 million significantly higher
- Primary reason: various CARES Act related grants
- CARES Act grants comprise \$109.6 million of 2020 expenditures (67.1%)
- Coronavirus Relief Fund is largest CARES Act grant
 - \$102.98 million award
 - \$91.95 million expenditures in 2020
 - 83.9% of CARES Act expenditures
 - 56.3% of 2020 grant expenditures
