
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

Departmental Budget Appropriation Category







Amount of the 2022 Personnel

Vacancies


- 3 of 33 Assistant City Attorney positions.
- 3 of 24 non-attorney positions:
 - o Auxiliary Personnel Paralegal
 - o IT Specialist Senior
 - o Office Legal Assistant

The Personnel Cost Adjustment may require that vacancies be held open to meet the Salary budget.

Staffing

To address vacancies and improve recruitment and retention, the department plans to:

- Enhance succession planning and crosstraining to ensure flexibility.
- Explore options to resume merit pay based on performance evaluations.
- Use auxiliary personnel to help with workflow from vacancies.






Number of eviction cases handled in 2020, down from 253 in 2019.

Number of liability claims received in 2020, down 30% from 2019; 520 liability claims were closed in 2020.




Legal Services

The COVID-19 pandemic created a significant increase in legal work for the Employment/ Labor/ Benefits/ Contracting Section. Services included:

- Advise DER and Budget Office regarding permitted uses of CARES and ARPA.
- Assist MHD with coronavirus relief grants, FEMA support, vaccine clinic collaboration agreements.
- Advise MFD regarding ambulance service contracts.
- Advise and assist enforcement of COVID-19 isolation, quarantine, business closure orders.
- Draft health orders and provide related legal guidance.
- Staff and advise Board of Health.
- COVID-19 employment issues, including mandatory vaccines.
