








BLUEPRINT VISION

- ❖ Given out over 9K gun locks to the community from January 1, 2021 to date





Capacity to compile, track, and assess aligned contributions	Hiring a Data and Research Analyst and launching Blueprint for Peace Steering Committee		
Relationship between MPD and OVP	Stronger relationship under current leadership		
Capacity of Grassroots agencies to access city funding	Working with Department of Administration, SDC, Milwaukee County and SWIM to support capacity building of grassroots and nonprofit organizations		
Local Budgetary Constraints	Advocating for resources at state and federal level		
Major Leadership Changes in MPS, MPD, MHD, Healthcare, Milwaukee County, etc.	Build systemic support and engagement within agencies/systems for continuity

CHALLENGES

- Covid-19
- Increase in spontaneous acts of gun violence (ex. road rage)
- Increasing levels of family and domestic violence
- 300% increase in state gun purchases in March 2020
- Capacity to respond to increasing demands for support across the city
- Mental health support for community

INVESTMENT

- Over \$4 Million in funding to community based organizations focused on mental health, trauma prevention, and healing through ReCAST grant
- Over \$600K for City-County Trauma ResponsePartnership
- National funding from Google, Everytown, Public Welfare Foundation, and Annie E. Casey Foundation to support local violence prevention efforts
- 500K allocated from City to fund 414 LIFE
- ❖ BUILD Health Challenge Award for Sherman Park Blueprint implementation
- ❖ Justice for Families grant for expansion of DV/SA prevention
