### Key Operating Budget Changes and Highlights

- Several position types reclassified to higher wages
  - Electrician, Engineer, Engineering Tech & Drafting Tech
- Eliminated funding for five auxiliary Water Meter Technician positions
- Added two Program Assistant III to assist with LSL replacement program
- Added Customer Service Supervisor
- Water Plant Maintenance Assistants moved from Plants to Technology Services
- Reductions to Equipment, Debt Service

### Rate Case

#### **Timing**

- Last conventional rate case-November 2014: +11.4%
- Simplified Rate Cases in 2016, 2017, & 2019: +3%
- 2022 Conventional Rate Case
  - August 2021- Requested Application
  - October 2021- Communication to Council
  - November 2021- Application to be submitted
  - Spring 2022- New rates anticipated to be in effect

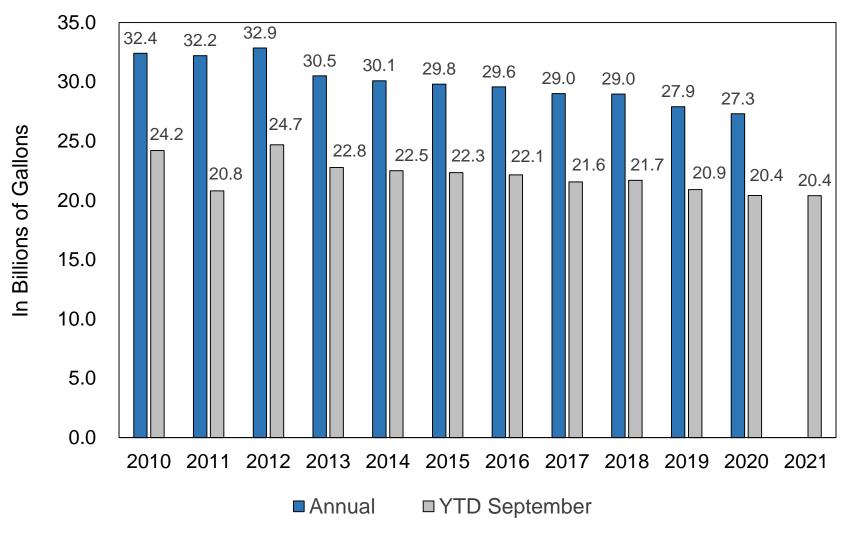
#### **Justification**

- PSC mandate to apply for conventional rate case
- Growing debt service obligations
- Benefits/advantages
  - Fund current operations, avoid drawdown on reserves
  - Cash-finance larger share of capital program to reduce future debt service
  - Present case to PSC for reducing water main replacement requirement from 20 miles to 14 miles

### Consumption & Revenue Trends

- 26.7% loss in consumption since 2004
  - 1.7% average consumption loss per year
- Revenues are highly sensitive to changes in consumption
- Regular rate increases are necessary to continue to fund operations
  - Fixed costs > variable costs
- 2021 water consumption up 0.1% from 2020

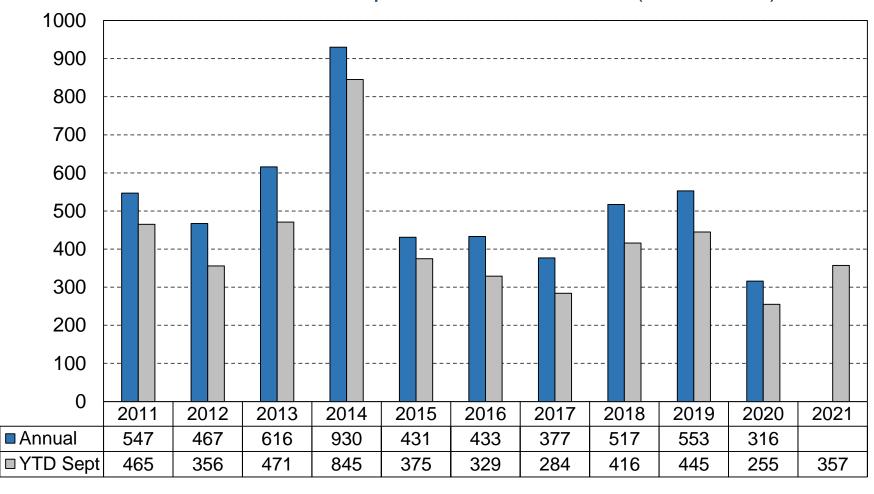

### Capital Budget Highlights

- Water Main Improvements: \$32.6m
  - Replaces 20 miles of water main per PSC requirement
  - ~\$1.4m per mile
  - Replaces 300 LSL's with main replacement projects, plus another 200 with paving projects
- Treatment Plants, Pumps, & Meter Shop Repairs: \$10.5m
  - Electrical upgrades at both Linnwood & Howard Treatment Plants
  - Repairs to revetment wall at Linnwood Plant
  - Filter bed replacement
  - Pavement replacement at Linnwood Plant and Meter Shop

### Lead Service Line Update

- 900 projected LSL replacements in 2021
- 670 filter pitchers issued as of September 30, 2021
- Protocol for entering properties safely
- Planned projects include paving projects
- Safe Drinking Water Loan Program (SDWLP) funding for 2020, 2021, and 2022 replacements
- Corrosion Control Treatment Study ongoing to ensure optimization
- Lead and Copper Rule Revisions timing uncertain, currently September 2024 for compliance

### Impact of COVID-19

- \$1.2m in grants for COVID-19 related expenses
- Replaced 17.1 miles of main in 2020
- 887 LSL replacements in 2020
- Implemented alternative work arrangements
- Continued workforce impacts
- Supply chain impacts

### Other Initiatives

- Water Equity and Affordability
- Asset Management
- Efforts to reduce non-revenue water savings of up to \$129,000 in water production costs YTD in 2021
- Partnership for Safe Water Distribution System
- Wholesale Water
  - PSC approved construction of main and pumping station to provide water to Waukesha
  - Franklin negotiations continue
