




# 2020 Accomplishments

#### Supporting Neighborhood Development

- Creation of 3 new neighborhood TIDs:
  - 37th Street School (43 units affordable housing)
  - Community Within the Corridor (mixed-use with affordable housing)
  - McKinley School (affordable and market rate housing)
- Amended 6 TIDs:
  - Cathedral Place(Infrastructure & Donations to neighborhood TID)
  - New Arcade (Infrastructure & Donations to neighborhood TID)
  - Milwaukee Intermodal Passenger Station (Infrastructure & Donations to neighborhood TID)
  - First Place (Riverwalk/Infrastructure)
  - Grand Avenue (Donations to neighborhood TIDs)
  - West McKinley/West Juneau (affordable student housing)











# Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee (RACM)

- Independent public corporate body created by state statute in 1958
- Governed by 7 member board
- Appointed by Mayor; Approved by Council
- Mission

"...eliminate blighting conditions that inhibit neighborhood reinvestment, to foster and promote business expansion and job creation, and to facilitate new business and housing development."

# RACM Tools for Economic Development

- Acquisition and disposition of the most challenging property in the City
- Preparation and implementation of redevelopment plans
- Issuance of Bonds
- Creative roles in real estate transactions including tax credit deals

## **RACM 2022 Budget Components**

## **Budget Total - \$7,048,709**

### RACM General Funds \$2,698,709

- \$1.3 million reimbursement to City for 2022 salaries (12 FTE's)
- \$400,000 for In rem maintenance
- \$125,000 for City Attorney fees
- \$400,000 Century City maintenance

### Grant/City Funds \$4,350,000

 Grand Trunk Wetland, Federal & State Grants (EPA, DNR, WEDC)
