Stats. for purposes of deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business which requires a closed session for competitive or bargaining reasons. The Board may then reconvene in open session concerning any such item following the closed session.

This meeting may also simultaneously constitute a meeting of the Fire and Police Commission or any of the following committees or subcommittees: Research and Rules, Testing and Recruiting, Policies and Standards. Whether a simultaneous meeting is occurring depends on whether the presence of one or more of the Fire and Police Commission members results in a quorum or a negative quorum of the Commission or another committee and whether any agenda items listed above involve matters within that committee's realm of authority. In the even that a simultaneous meeting is occurring, no action other than information gathering will be taken at the simultaneous meeting.
