Resolution designating the James S. Brown Double House, 1122-1124 North Astor Street, as an Historic Structure, in the 4th Aldermanic District.

This resolution designates the James S. Brown Double House, 1122-1124 North Astor Street. Whereas, The Milwaukee Historic Preservation Ordinance, Section 308-81 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, as amended, provides that Historic Sites, Structures and Districts may be designated by the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee upon the recommendation of the Historic Preservation Commission; and

Whereas, The Historic Preservation Commission recommends that the James S. Brown Double House, 1122-1124 North Astor Street, be designated as an Historic Structure; and

Whereas, This structure possesses integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship and association and fulfills the following criterion set forth in Section 308 -81(2)(e):

e-3. Is identified with a person or persons who significantly contributed to the culture and development of the City of Milwaukee.

e-5. Its embodiment of the distinguishing characteristics of an architectural type or

e-9. Its unique location as a singular physical characteristic, which represents an established and familiar visual feature of a neighborhood, community or the City of Milwaukee; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the James S. Brown Double House, 1122-1124 North Astor Street, and further described as follows:

Subd of Block 105 in NW 1/4 SEC 28-7-22 Block 105 Lot 16 & E 33' of N 30' Lot 15

be designated as a Milwaukee Historic Structure. The Preservation Guidelines pursuant to the Historic Designation Study Report, a copy of which is attached to this Common Council File, shall apply to this structure and are adopted by the Common Council as part of this resolution.
