The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is soliciting applications to utilize funding under the Federal Transportation Alternatives Program. The Department of Public Works is applying for funding for one project. Successful grant applications will be funded with an 80 percent grantor share and a 20 percent local share. Whereas, The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is soliciting project applications for funding in fiscal years 2022-2023 under the Federal Transportation Alternatives Program; and

Whereas, Projects approved for the Federal Transportation Alternatives Program will be funded with an 80 percent grantor share and 20 percent local share; and

Whereas, The Department of Public Works has identified one project for a planning and feasibility study; and

Whereas, The Department of Public Works has submitted an application for the following project:

- 1. South Powerline Trail Planning Study

; and

Whereas, The total estimated cost of this project is \$210,000 with a grantor share of \$168,000 and a local share

of \$42,000;

Whereas, A local resolution of support for the proposed project must be executed and submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation prior to August 5, 2022; now, therefore, be it
