The Department of Public Works intends to submit four applications.

- 3. North Teutonia Avenue & West Villard Avenue
- 4. Three Connecting Highway Intersections

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Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the City Engineer is authorized to submit applications for the Highway Safety Improvement Program at the following locations:

- 1. North Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. & West North Avenue
- 2. West Kilbourn Avenue & North 6th Street
- 3. North Teutonia Avenue & West Villard Avenue
- 4. Three Connecting Highway Intersections
