Substitute resolution relative to the application, acceptance and funding of the Public Health Impact Initiative from the UW-Milwaukee School of Public Health.

This resolution authorizes the Health Department to apply for, accept and fund a Public Health Impact Initiative Grant project from the Center for Disease Control through the UW-Milwaukee School of Public Health in the amount of \$317,132. The purpose of the project is to improve healthy birth outcomes in Milwaukee.

Whereas, The City of Milwaukee appears to be eligible for grant funds from the UW-Milwaukee School of Public Health for the Public health Impact Initiative; and

Whereas, The operation of this grant project from 08/01/10 to 07/31/11 would cost \$317,132 entirely provided by the grantor; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that application to the UW-Milwaukee School of Public Health is authorized and the Health Department shall accept this grant without further approval unless the

terms of the grant change as indicated in Milwaukee Code of Ordinances Section 304-81; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the City Comptroller is authorized to:

1. Commit funds within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2010 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects fund, the following amount for the project titled Public Health Impact Initiative Grant:

2. Create the necessary Special Revenue Fund - Grant and Aid Project/Grant and Project Levels; budget to these Project/Grant values the amounts required under the grant agreement; and, be it

Further Resolved, That these funds are budgeted to the Health Department which is authorized to:

1. Expend from the amount appropriated sums for specified purposes as indicated in the grant budget and incur costs consistent with the award date;
2. Expend from the 2010 grant budget funds for specific items of equipment;
3. Expend from the 2010 grant budget funds for training and out-of-town travel for departmental staff.
4. Enter into subcontracts as specified in the grant budget.
