An ordinance relating to night parking permits for certain trucks.

101-27-2-b am

This ordinance permits a truck, which displays the name of a commercial enterprise, but is no larger than 21 feet in length, 7 feet in width, and 7 feet in height with no more than 2 single tired wheels on the front axle and no more than 2 single-tired or double-tired wheels on the rear axle to apply for an all night parking permit.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. Section 101-27-2-b of the code is amended to read:

101-27. All Night Parking.

2. SPECIAL PERMIT.

b. The owner of any motor truck with valid license plates issued by the Wisconsin department of transportation, division of motor vehicles, ~~[[but not used for commercial purposes]]~~ >>including any motor truck displaying the name of a commercial enterprise<<, and which is not larger than 21 feet in length, 7 feet in width, and 7 feet in height and which has no more than 2 single-tired wheels on the front axle and no more than 2 single-tired or double-tired wheels on the rear axle, shall be eligible to purchase a special privilege permit for said vehicle as provided in this section.
