A substitute ordinance creating a special purpose fund for job training and business development, and providing for entry into the fund of forfeiture payments for certain violations in cruising enforcement areas and violations of unlawful assemblies involving motor vehicles.

304-26 cr

This ordinance creates a special purpose fund for the purpose of supporting and promoting job training and business development in the city of Milwaukee. Revenues shall be entered into the fund from the payments of forfeitures for the violation of ordinances prohibiting cruising, penalizing unlawful assemblies involving motor vehicles, and penalizing certain ordinance violations occurring between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. in areas designated cruising enforcement areas. The common council shall authorize expenditures from the fund for the benefit of disadvantaged youth in the city of Milwaukee through the support of programs, activities or other efforts relating to the promotion of job training, the alleviation of unemployment and the development of business and business opportunities.

Whereas, Many youth in the city of Milwaukee are disadvantaged due to a lack of training, education and employment opportunities; and

Whereas, Reducing unemployment by increasing educational, training and employment opportunities contributes to a reduction in crime, disruptive behavior and violence; and

Whereas, Businesses in the city of Milwaukee should be encouraged to expand opportunities for youth training, education and employment; and

Whereas, Revenues from forfeiture payments for cruising and unlawful assembly violations and from the enhanced penalties for ordinance violations in designated cruising areas can be used to invest in the future welfare and well-being of youth and the prevention of unemployment and crime; now, therefore

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. Section 304-26 of the code is created to read:

304-26. Job Training and Business Development Fund. 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this section is to promote job training, alleviate unemployment and promote business development and business opportunities for disadvantaged youth in the city.

2. SPECIAL PURPOSE FUND. A special purpose fund for job training and business development shall be created in the general fund at the earliest appropriate time at the discretion of the city comptroller. Amounts equal to all revenues derived from payments of forfeitures for violations of

ordinances identified in sub. 3 occurring on and after September 1, 2006, shall be entered into the special purpose fund. The common council may, by resolution, designate additional or other funds for entry into this special fund. Expenditures from this special purpose fund shall be made in accordance with sub. 4.

3. ENTRY OF REVENUES FROM FORFEITURES. Amounts equal to payments of forfeitures received for violations of the code with respect to the following identified penalties shall be entered into the special purpose fund for job training and business development:

a. Section 101-20.5-5.

b. Section 105-1-3-c.

c. The penalties for violations occurring between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. on any street designated as a cruising area or temporary cruising area under s. 101-20.5-1 and 4 provided pursuant to ss. 79-6-1-c, 80-91, 101-34-2, 101-34-7, 105-2, 105-34-3-c to 3-d, 105-138-3, 106-1, 106-1.8-2, 106-5-2, and 106-31-10.

4. EXPENDITURES. The special purpose fund for job training and business development shall be under the control of the common council. Expenditures from the special fund shall be authorized by resolution from time to time as appropriate. Expenditures shall benefit disadvantaged youth in the city through the support of programs, activities or other efforts relating to the promotion of job training, the alleviation of unemployment and the development of business and business opportunities.
