Resolution authorizing acceptance and funding of a 2018/2019 Wisconsin Human Trafficking Task Force grant.

This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Police Department to accept a Wisconsin Human Trafficking Task Force grant from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the amount of \$36,687.50 with a city share of \$-0- and a grantor share of \$36,687.50. The purpose of this grant is to fund overtime expenses for two officers whose purpose is to address cases involving sex trafficking and forced labor trafficking, as needed.

Whereas, The City of Milwaukee appears to be eligible for a Wisconsin Human Trafficking Task Force grant from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI); and

Whereas, The operation of this grant from 10/01/18 to 09/30/19 would cost \$36,687.50, of which 100% would be provided by the grantor; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Police Department is authorized to accept this grant without further approval unless its terms change as indicated in Section 304-81, Milwaukee Code of Ordinances; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the City Comptroller is authorized to:

1. Commit funds within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2018 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects Fund, the following amounts for the project titled: 18-19 Human Trafficking Task Force Grant:
