A substitute ordinance requiring that a private alarm system not maintaining a place of business in Wisconsin maintain a registered office and registered agent in Wisconsin.

- Analysis -

This substitute ordinance requires that a private alarm system not maintaining a place of business in Wisconsin maintain a registered office and a registered agent in the state for service of process, notice or demand required or permitted by law to be served on foreign corporations. This information shall be filed with the city clerk. Private alarm systems currently operating in the city have 60 days from the effective date of this ordinance to comply with this provision.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

- Part 1. Section 105-75-3-b-5 and 6 is renumbered 105-75-3-b-6 and 7.
- Part 2. Section 105-75-3-b-5 of the code is created to read:
- 105-75. Private Alarm Systems and Regulations.
- 3. LICENSING OF ALARM BUSINESS.

b-5. All applicants not maintaining a place of business in the state of Wisconsin shall continuously maintain in this state a registered office and a registered agent for service of process, notice or demand required and permitted by law to be served on foreign corporations, the address of such office and the name and address of such registered agent to be filed with the city clerk.

Part 3. Alarm businesses licensed under s. 105-75 have 60 days from the effective date of this ordinance April 29, 2000 to comply with s. 105-75-3-b-5.
