## THE CHAIR

Resolution authorizing acceptance and funding of a Child Exploitation Task Force Equipment grant. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Police Department to accept a Child Exploitation Task Force Equipment grant from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the amount of \$23,645. The purpose of this grant is to purchase equipment for use by the Child Exploitation Task Force. Whereas, The City of Milwaukee appears to be eligible for a Child Exploitation Task Force Equipment grant from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI); and

Whereas, The operation of this grant from 6/19/17 to 9/15/17 would cost \$23,645, of which 100% would be provided by the grantor; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Police Department is authorized to accept this grant without further approval unless its terms change as indicated in Section 304-81, Milwaukee Code of Ordinances; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the City Comptroller is authorized to:

1. Commit funds within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2017 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects Fund, the following amounts for the project titled: Child Exploitation Task Force Equipment grant:
