181527 SUBSTITUTE 1

#### THE CHAIR

A substitute ordinance relating to a humane officer.

78-20 cr 78-23-9 am

This ordinance stipulates a humane officer be appointed by the commissioner of neighborhood services, and serve upon confirmation by the common council. A humane officer:

- 1. Advises department of neighborhood services and the Milwaukee police department on issues relating to animal cruelty.
- 2. Serves as an expert witness as needed.
- 3. Is a member of the dangerous animal panel to hear appeals of animal control orders.
- 4. May seize and impound animals found at large.
- 5. May request law enforcement officers to enforce and prosecute violations of this section and state statutes, and may cooperate in those prosecutions.

In addition, this ordinance eliminates a humane officer's authority to issue an order declaring an animal dangerous animal and ordering the owner or caretaker to present the animal to the animal control commission for insertion of a microchip for identification.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. Section 78-20 of the code is created to read:

- **78-20. Humane Officer. 1.** APPOINTMENT. A humane officer shall be appointed by the commissioner, and serve upon confirmation by the common council.
- **2.** DUTIES. The humane officer shall advise the commissioner and the Milwaukee police department on issues relating to animal cruelty, serve as an expert witness as needed and serve as a member of the dangerous animal panel as provided in s. 78-25-2-b-2.
- **3.** AUTHORITY. The humane officer has the authority to seize an animal found at large and impound it in a place designated by the commissioner. In addition, a humane officer may request law enforcement officers to enforce and prosecute violations of this section and state statutes, and may cooperate in those prosecutions.

Part 2. Section 78-23-9 of the code is amended to read:

### 78-23. Harboring Dangerous Animals.

**9.** DECLARATION AND ORDER. Upon investigation, a department [[or humane officer]] may issue an order declaring an animal to be a dangerous animal and ordering the owner or caretaker to

present the animal to the Milwaukee area domestic animal control commission for the purpose of having a microchip inserted for identification purposes. The cost of the microchip procedure shall be at the expense of the owner.
